16% of people living in Miami County are living with financial hardship (State poverty average is 14%)

28% of households in Miami County are living paycheck to paycheck, are unable to save and are often one emergency from poverty

96% of Miami County ninth graders graduate in four years

3,300 backpacks are sent home filled with nutritional food through the Weekend Meal Deal Program

2,250 Miami County residents struggle to find mental health providers, ranking 28th statewide

619 children received a back pack full of school supplies, hygiene products, and a gift certificate for gym shoes

464 children received books monthly provided by Dollywood Imagination Library in collaboration with Miami Co. schools


OUR VISION – Strengthening our community one life at a time.

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
